Small group members or individuals enter into the stories by considering what the people in the stories said and did, what they may have felt, wanted, or feared. Beginning with the "Wedding at Cana" and ending with "Doubting Thomas," the weekly sessions move from the opening of Jesus' public ministry to the confusion and doubt after his resurrection. They look at the questions and concerns of his opponents, the Pharisees, and those of his followers. Small group leader training would be ideal, but any group could begin meeting using the basic guidelines provided in the Signs and Wonders appendices on how to prepare; small group facilitation; prayer in the group; and group dynamics.
